



DAY 1 Tuesday 15 September, 2026 Departure

Our holiday begins with our flight to Rome, Italy.

DAY 2 Wednesday 16 September, 2026 Bagno Vignoni, Tuscany

On arrival in Rome we travel north to the Tuscan village of Bagno Vignoni, a small Orcia River valley village, which has long been a favourite among painters and travellers seeking solitude in a beautiful location. We'll spend the next three nights at Le Terme, a charming, family-run 15th-century hotel, originally built by Rossellino as a summer retreat for Pope Pius II. Set beside the village's historic hot spring, the hotel offers the unique opportunity to relax in ancient thermal waters at its wellness spa, renowned for their soothing and revitalising properties. Each evening, we'll enjoy delicious home-cooked Italian meals, prepared with local ingredients and served in true Tuscan style.


DAY 3 Thursday 17 September, 2026 Bagno Vignoni

In the morning we will visit La Foce established by the author Iris Origo and her husband Marquis Antonio Origo on the site of an Osteria. In 1927, they enlisted renowned garden designer Cecil Pinsent to help shape their vision. Pinsent framed the garden with cypresses and hollies, creating a green architectural border. Within this elegant structure lies a series of distinct spaces: a classical Italian Renaissance garden, a tranquil fountain garden, an orangery, and an upper flower garden inspired by the rich, romantic planting style of Gertrude Jekyll. This afternoon will be free to explore the gorgeous village of Bagno Vignoni.

DAY 4 Friday 18 September, 2026 Bagno Vignoni

This morning we visit Villa Vicobello a magnificent 16th-century estate built by the influential Chigi family. The gardens are a splendid example of Italian Renaissance garden design, laid out across a series of elegant terraces linked by stairways and laid out along two distinct axes. As we soak up the magic of this wonderful garden you will delve deeper into the history of the Chigi family, who have owned the villa since 1500s. After our garden visit, a





local guide will introduce us to the major sights of Siena, including the famous Piazza del Campo with its splendid civic tower and the enormous, partially completed Duomo. The main piazza is the track for the twice-yearly Palio horse race festival, a fierce competition between the local city wards. Siena is also home to the oldest bank in the world and has a spectacular town hall.

DAY 5 Saturday 19 September, 2026

This morning, we will travel south to Rome. On the journey we visit the magnificent gardens of Villa Lante near Viterbo. This is a perfect Renaissance Garden in which murmuring water, flashing fountains, shade and sunlight alternate under vast plane trees. The garden, organized on four levels along a main axis, emphasized by fountains, has perfect symmetry. Upon arrival a local guide takes us on a tour of Rome — an entire city designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Highlights include the iconic Colosseum, the ancient Roman Forum, St Peter's Basilica and the Vatican, along with the Spanish Steps and the Trevi Fountain.

DAY 6 Sunday 20 September, 2026 Rome

Today we explore wild and romantic gardens that will be unforgettable highlights of our journey. The Garden of Ninfa (Giardino di Ninfa) is widely regarded as one of the most beautiful and acclaimed gardens in the world. Located in the Lazio, about 40 miles southeast of Rome. Ninfa was once a thriving town dating back to Roman times. The ruins have been transformed into a botanical garden. Plants wind over ruined towers and walls, rejoicing in the lush conditions. The atmospheric setting features roses scrambling for footholds in ruined archways, and the frescoed church wall still standing open to the weather. An unusual mixture of species including magnolias, maples and tropical plants thrive in the damp microclimate. After lunch we visit the extraordinary private gardens of Torrecchia Vecchia near Cisterna where striking plantings weave through ancient ruins in a style that beautifully balances wild nature with

thoughtful design. The gardens encircle a hilltop dotted with medieval ruins and a 17th-century villa adjoining the remains of a 13th-century castle. In 1994, the owners enlisted celebrated British landscape designer Dan Pearson to create a 1.75-hectare garden set among the ruins. He later brought in renowned English gardener Stuart Barfoot, who has since expanded and deepened the garden's wild, romantic spirit.

DAY 7 Monday 21 September, 2026 Rome

This morning, we will enjoy free time to explore Rome. In the afternoon, we travel to Tivoli to visit the spectacular Villa d'Este, celebrated for its extraordinary use of water in garden design. Fed by a tunnelled aqueduct from the River Aniene, the garden was created by the architect Pirro Ligorio for Cardinal Ippolito d'Este. Highlights include the enchanting Rometta, a miniature representation of ancient Rome with its seven hills and the Tiber River, the famous Path of One Hundred Fountains, and the remarkable Fountain of the Organ, which plays music using waterpower, based on hydraulic principles first described by Hero of Alexandria in 100 AD.

DAY 8 Tuesday 22 September, 2026 Embarkation

This morning we travel to Civitavecchia, to board the luxurious Celebrity Equinox for our nine-night Mediterranean cruise.



DAY 9 Wednesday 23 September, 2026 Naples

After docking in Naples we travel to the ferry terminal, and take a boat across to the island of Ischia to visit the renowned garden, La Mortella, once home of Sir William and Lady Susana Walton. This lush, hillside garden is a paradise for plant lovers, filled with rare trees, exotic palms, vibrant shrubs, ferns, and bulbs from around the world. Highlights include an Islamic-style rill that leads gracefully to a reflective pool, part of an extension by celebrated designer Russell Page. He also constructed a series of rock pools, bordered by bog plants, ferns and bamboo, that provide striking contrast to the parched Mediterranean hillside. The garden is also home to a beautiful memorial to Lady Walton, nestled in a tranquil corner. La Mortella is a feast for the senses.

DAY 10 Thursday 24 September, 2026

DAY 11 Friday 25 September, 2026

La Spezia/Lucca

This morning, we dock in La Spezia for an overnight stay and travel to the town of Collodi, famous for its connection with the Pinocchio legend. Our day begins with a visit to the magnificent Villa Garzoni, an exquisite example of Italian baroque garden design. Built shortly before 1652 by the Garzoni family, the garden layout makes the dramatic use of a steep hillside in a manner more commonly associated with Roman landscapes. Its highlights include a grand water garden at the base of the slope, elegant balustraded terraces and a series of sweeping symmetrical staircases connecting the lower water gardens to the villa above, the cascade, the teatro di verdura and formal plantings. We then continue to Lucca arriving in time for lunch or some free time to explore. In the afternoon a local guide leads us through this enchanting walled city, rich with churches, palaces, and charming piazzas that reflect its well-preserved



DAY 12 Saturday 26 September, 2026 La Spezia/ Florence

This morning, we journey through the stunning Tuscan countryside to the heart of Florence. On arrival we'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the city's historical centre exploring the Piazza del Duomo, home of the magnificent Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore — one of the largest in the Christian world — topped by Brunelleschi's wonderful dome. We'll also see the elegant Campanile and the octagonal Baptistery with its famous bronze doors. Our walk continues through the Piazza della Signoria, where we take in the Loggia della Signoria, the Palazzo Vecchio and nearby, the Ponte Vecchio spanning over the Arno River.



We visit the exquisite Villa Gamberaia, nestled in classic olive-grove country. This small but idyllic garden is beautifully restored to its 16th-century splendour. The main terrace is laid out with parterres de broderie and the water gardens evoke the serene beauty of Persian reflecting pools.

DAY 13 Sunday 27 September, 2026 Portofino

Today we dock in the gorgeous village of Portofino, often ranked among Italy's top ten most beautiful villages. You'll have time to wander its charming streets, enjoy the views of the picturesque harbour, and perhaps browse the local boutiques or enjoy a coffee by the waterfront. Later we visit the Abbey of La Cervara in Santa Margherita Ligure. Founded in 1361 for Benedictine monks, the abbey boasts a magnificent terrace overlooking the sea. The formal garden, created in 1868 features elegant box parterres centred around a fountain adorned with cherubs.

DAY 14 Monday 28 September, 2026 Villefranche/Nice

This morning, we visit the renowned La Serre de la Madone a beautifully layered garden designed by Lawrence Johnston during the interwar years, following



his celebrated work at Hidcote in England. In the afternoon Phil will lead the group on our visit to the exquisite Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild. Created in the early 20th century by Baroness Ephrussi de Rothschild, this opulent estate features a series of themed gardens, each reflecting a distinct architectural and planting style. From Spanish to Japanese to Florentine, it's a dazzling display of French elegance and exotic charm — an unforgettable highlight of the Riviera.

DAY 15 Tuesday 29 September, 2026 Marseille

This morning, we arrive in Marseille, a vibrant port city that has served as a crossroads of trade since its founding by the Greeks around 600 B.C. From here, we travel to the elegant Domaine D'Albertas, set in a picturesque valley nourished by natural springs. Originally used to irrigate orchards and vegetable gardens, these springs were harnessed to create ponds and fountains that define the gardens today. Designed in the 17th century, the grounds reflect a harmonious blend of Italian and Renaissance styles, featuring formal box hedges, graceful judas trees, and grand statues inspired by Greek mythology.

DAY 16 Wednesday 30 September, 2026 At Sea

Today is yours to relax and enjoy the wonderful facilities of the ship. In the afternoon, join Phil for an engaging talk as he shares stories from his fascinating career in the media, spanning radio, television, writing, and garden design.

DAY 17 Thursday 1 October, 2026

Disembarkation/Barcelona

This morning, we arrive in vibrant Barcelona, the captivating capital of Catalonia and Spain's second-largest city. We begin with a guided sightseeing tour, taking in the city's rich history and dynamic architecture. Highlights include the striking Cathedral of Barcelona and the winding medieval streets of the Gothic Quarter. We then head to the Eixample district, known for its bold modernist design, where we admire some of Gaudí's most iconic works - including the awe-inspiring Sagrada Família. In the afternoon, we visit the whimsical and world-famous Park Güell, also designed by Gaudí. This unique space blends architecture and landscape in brilliant harmony, with lush, naturalistic plantings, a grand iron-balustrade entrance, colourful mosaic-tiled walls, and the famous staircase dragon – one of Barcelona's most beloved symbols.

DAY 18 Friday 2 October, 2026 Barcelona

This morning, we travel north to the Costa Brava to visit the Jardi Botanic Marimurtra, a remarkable garden created by plant enthusiast Karl Faust. Faust designed a series of distinct garden zones to showcase his vast collection of plants from around the world. Today, the garden is thoughtfully divided into tropical, temperate, and Mediterranean sections, each offering its own unique atmosphere and botanical treasures. In the afternoon, we visit Santa Clotilde, a grand estate built on the site of an old vineyard. It is an Italianate Garden in the Renaissance style, where the symmetry of paths, planting and carefully placed focal points create a sense of harmony and timeless beauty. This evening, we gather for a farewell dinner to celebrate the tour and the unforgettable gardens we've explored together.

DAY 19 Saturday 3 October, 2026

Departure

Today we transfer to Barcelona Airport for our return flight to Australia.

DAY 20 Sunday 4 October, 2026 Arrive Australia
