DAY 1 Thursday 9 April 2026 Sydney

Arrive in Sydney and enjoy a welcome dinner with your tour leader and group. Sydney, spectacularly draped around its glorious harbor and beaches, has visual wow factor like few other cities. This evening, we'll catch the Light Rail to Central Station to enjoy dinner at a restaurant in the Eveleigh Railyards. Overnight: The Vibe Hotel, Sydney (D)

DAY 2 Friday 10 April 2026 Bowral

This morning, you'll take a local train to the picturesque Southern Highlands town of Bowral where the famous Sir Donald Bradman grew up. On arrival, enjoy free time at lunch and tour the Bradman Museum and International Cricket Hall of Fame Museum, the gardens and heritage home





at the 1821 built Retford Park, the delightful town centre and the world-renowned Fairground Follies – a Mechanical Music Museum and a treasure trove of nostalgic delights. This evening, you'll stay in a heritage property on the outskirts of town and enjoy fine dining at dinner. *Overnight: Berida Hotel, Bowral (B,D)*

DAY 3 Saturday 11 April 2026 Kiama

This morning, you'll visit the NSW Rail Museum in Thirlmere to explore Australia's largest collection of heritage rolling stock including the stunning Governor General's Carriage and the Rail Pay Bus. Enjoy a ride on a vintage heritage steam locomotive from historic Thirlmere Station to

Take part in an unforgettable 13-day rail tour of New South Wales to experience historic railways, the wonderful Hunter Valley Steamfest and fascinating towns. Start in Sydney and enjoy dinner at the Eveleigh Railyards before travelling to the picturesque Southern Highlands town of Bowral to tour the Bradman Museum. Enjoy a vintage heritage steam loco ride at the NSW Rail Museum in Thirlmere, see the famous Kiama Blowhole and visit the Light Railway Museum at Albion Park where you'll ride on a steam train. Later, enjoy a trip on the famous Cockatoo Run, a vintage train through the Southern Highlands to Robertson and finish by riding a heritage tram at the Sydney Tramway Museum in Loftus. Drop in to the Goulburn Rail Heritage Centre, tour the former railway workshops, the Junee Roundhouse Railway Museum, and have dinner at the historic 1878 built Junee Hotel. Spend two nights in Bathurst where you'll take a peak inside the Bathurst Railway Museum, tour Abercrombie House and have dinner in their grand ballroom. Explore the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway centre where you'll enjoy a workshop tour and High Tea in their heritage rail carriage. In Lithgow, you'll ride on the 19th century historic Zig Zag Railway, venture down to Katoomba to see the famous Three Sisters and tour Scenic World, home to the world's steepest railway, plus the Scenic Skyway and Cableway. Have High Tea at the Hydro Majestic Hotel, ride heritage train to Kandos and spend the full day at the Hunter Valley Steamfest to see and ride on their spectacular collection of steam trains. Finish by enjoying a wine tour and lunch in the Hunter Valley before returning to Sydney.

DAY 4 Sunday 12 April 2026 Kiama

This morning, you'll tour the Light Railway Museum at Albion Park and enjoy a ride on a steam train before taking a ride on the famous Cockatoo Run, a vintage train operated by East Coast Heritage Rail from Wollongong via the beautiful Southern Highlands to Moss Vale (*subject to track work). Enjoy reliving the railway experience of years gone by in the beautifully restored luxury of the heritage Lounge Class. Later, take a step back in time at the Sydney Tramway Museum in Loftus and take a ride on a heritage tram. Return to Kiama for a free evening. Overnight: The Sebel, Kiama (B)



DAY 5 Monday 13 April 2026 Goulburn – Junee

Today you will drive to the Goulburn Rail Heritage Centre and former railway workshops. Tour the museum, the roundhouse and turntable, ancillary buildings and see the restoration of heritage rolling stock. Enjoy free time at lunch and tour the Junee Roundhouse Railway Museum. Explore the largest roundhouse in the Southern Hemisphere and check into your hotel. Tonight, you'll enjoy dinner at the historic 1878 built Junee Hotel. *Overnight: Junee Motor Inn, Junee (B,D)*



DAY 6 Tuesday 14 April 2026 Junee – Cowra – Bathurst

This morning, explore Junee, a pretty country town and a major stop on the Melbourne-Sydney railway line. See the delectable Licorice and Chocolate Factory, the Ray Warren statue and stop for morning tea at the old Railway Refreshment Rooms at Junee station. You'll pause at the heritage-listed, 1940s Bethungra Rail Spiral, one of Australia's most significant rail engineering feats of its time and tour the Cowra Heritage Rail Depot to wander through an extraordinary collection of historic engines, carriages and wagons. Arrive in Bathurst in the late afternoon. *Overnight: Rydges Hotel, Bathurst (B)*



DAY 7 Wednesday 15 April 2026 Bathurst

This morning, we'll wander the heart of Bathurst to see some historic sights before exploring the Bathurst Railway Museum where you'll enjoy morning tea. Later, see the finest and rarest mineral crystals and fossils from around the world at the Australian Fossils and Minerals Museum and enjoy free time for lunch. In the mid-afternoon, you'll tour the 19th century granite and sandstone building of Abercrombie House. You'll marvel at this outstanding example of Victorian Tudor style architecture and enjoy dinner in their grand ballroom. Overnight: Rydges Hotel, Bathurst (B,D)



DAY 8 Thursday 16 April 2026 Oberon – Lithgow

After breakfast, there's free time to explore the National Motor Racing Museum next to our hotel to learn about the spiritual home of Australian motor racing, Mount Panorama. Later, you'll travel to Renzaglia Wines, nestled in beautiful rolling hills just south of Bathurst for an exquisite lunch and wine tasting. Arrive at Oberon, to explore the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway centre where you'll enjoy a workshop tour and High Tea in their



heritage rail carriage. Arrive in Lithgow in the late afternoon for a free evening. Overnight: Lithgow Workies Club Motel, Lithgow (B,L)



DAY 9 Friday 17 April 2026 Zig Zag – Katoomba – Lithgow

Today you will soak up the sights, smells and scenery of the Blue Mountains on a 19th century historic rail adventure on the Zig Zag Railway. Enjoy a relaxing ride on the romantic and nostalgic steam locomotive as it hauls you over the Great Lithgow Zig Zag. Enjoy lunch together and hop aboard a local train at the 7-metre long Zig Zag Station, for a journey through a dozen tunnels and through bushland to Katoomba where you'll enjoy High Tea at the timeless elegance of the Hydro Majestic Hotel Blue Mountains, see the famous Three Sisters and tour Scenic World, home to the world's steepest railway, plus the Scenic Skyway and Cableway. *Overnight: Lithgow Workies Club Motel, Lithgow (B,L)*

DAY 10 Saturday 18 April 2026 Kandos Heritage train – Hunter Valley

This morning, you'll experience a nostalgic heritage rail journey from Lithgow to Kandos on a privately chartered rail carriage. These 620/720 class railcars are a class of diesel-hydraulic multiple units (DHMU) and operated from 1961 until 2007. Travel through the breathtaking Capertee Valley and enjoy a scenic ride through the World Heritage-listed Blue Mountains, crossing the Great Dividing Range to Kandos, where you'll have lunch on their Railway Station platform. Later, drive the 3 hours to the Hunter Valley and check into your hotel. *Overnight: Punthill Maitland, Hunter Valley (B,L)*

DAY 11 Sunday 19 April 2026 Hunter Valley Steamfest

The entire day today is devoted to the Hunter Valley Steamfest – a celebration of steam power, history, and fun! The heart and soul of Steamfest is



its spectacular collection of steam trains. Witness the thrill of the annual ARTC Great Train Race and hop aboard a heritage steam train ride to explore stunning Hunter destinations. Step back in time at The Bloomfield Group Steam Rally, home to a vast display of antique machinery, traction and portable engines and see over 500 classic cars, plus food stalls, live entertainment, heritage walks, market stalls, gourmet food, and much more. *Overnight: Punthill Maitland, Hunter Valley (B)*

DAY 12 Monday 20 April 2026 Hunter Valley Wineries – Sydney

This morning, you'll tour the scenic Hunter Valley around Pokolbin and enjoy lunch at the Audrey Wilkinson Winery. If there was an award for the most picturesque winery in the Hunter, Audrey Wilkinson would win it hands down. Best of all, the wines inside the country-house tasting room stand tall as well. Soak in the breathtaking views of the Brokenback Mountain Ranges as you sip stand outs such as semillon, chardonnay and shiraz over lunch. Return to Maitland for the early afternoon TrainLink express service to Sydney Central Station. Check in and enjoy a farewell dinner together. *Overnight: The Vibe Hotel, Sydney (B,L,D)*

DAY 13 Tuesday 21 April 2026 Sydney – Depart

Our tour comes to an end this morning after breakfast and hotel check-out. (B)

No alterations to costings will be made within 60 days of departure.

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS: A non-refundable deposit of \$900 per passenger is required at the time of booking. Full payment will be required 60 days before departure. A 1.5% administration charge will be added to payment by Visa, Mastercard and America Express.

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellations within 60 days prior to departure will result in the loss of all monies paid.
