DAY 1 Sunday 22 November 2026 Departure

This evening, we board our flight to Tokyo via Singapore. Talk to your consultant about direct flight options, upgrades and pre tour accommodation.

DAY 2 Monday 23 November 2026 Tokyo, Japan

On arrival into Tokyo this morning, we meet our guide and transfer to the city for a sightseeing tour. We have an orientation tour of the city and see the famous fish market and the Asakusa district, well-known as a region of old Tokyo. We see the Asakusa Kannon Temple, a Buddhist temple also known as "Sensoji." The temple was built in 645 A.D with the finest Japanese architecture. Later we are transferred to our hotel. This afternoon will be at leisure.



DAY 3 Tuesday 24 November 2026 Tokyo

This morning, we enjoy a sightseeing tour of Tokyo. We visit the famous Ginza shopping district, renowned as the most expensive real estate in the world. We then visit the Imperial Palace East Gardens, which is part of the Royal residence, and a superb example of traditional Japanese landscape design. We then visit Meiji Shrine, dedicated to the spirits of Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken, the shrine is a popular place for traditional Japanese weddings. We'll also visit the famous Tokyo Tower. Inspired by the Eiffel Tower, the Tokyo Tower stands at 333m tall and is the second tallest structure in Japan. This evening we will enjoy a Welcome Dinner.

DAY 4 Wednesday 25 November 2026 Embarkation

The morning is free for individual sightseeing and shopping. Early afternoon we are transferred to the port to board the Diamond Princess. Make sure you're up on deck as the Diamond Princess slips her moorings and we start our cruise from Tokyo to Singapore.

DAY 5 Thursday 26 November 2026 At Sea

A day at sea to explore the fabulous facilities of this magnificent ship. This afternoon we have a fun session of Trivial Pursuit. You will be divided into groups, with prizes for the winners!



DAY 6 Friday 27 November 2026 Kagoshima

This morning, we arrive in Kagoshima, the twin city of Perth. We have a full day tour of the city known for its backdrop of the volcano of Sakurajima. We see the famous Iso-teien Garden which was laid out in traditional manner in 1660 by the 19th Shimazu Lord, a family that ruled this part of Japan for 29 generations spanning 700 years. We also see the Shimazu Villa where the family lived. Kimono-clad women guide you through the villa.

DAY 7 Saturday 28 November 2026 Nagasaki

Today we arrive in the city of Nagasaki. Best known as the site of the second nuclear attack on Japan during WWII, we have a sightseeing tour of the city. We see the Peace Memorial Park, located near Ground Zero, the centre of the blast, which is home to a beautiful memorial fountain and the 9-metre-high Statue of Peace. We will also see other parts of the city that was



for 200 years Japan's port to the outside world. This afternoon the group will walk to the nearby Glover Gardens and see early European settlers' houses surrounded by attractive gardens. Group members can explore at their own pace.

DAY 8 Sunday 29 November 2026 At Sea

DAY 9 Monday 30 November 2026 Ishigaki

Japan's southernmost city is a tropical paradise—sun, sea, sand and healthy coral reefs that stretch for miles. On our sightseeing tour we cruise in a glass-bottom boat around Kabira Bay. We will see brilliantly coloured fish, giant clams and coral reefs in the turquoise waters where black pearls are cultivated primarily for export. We then travel to Ishigaki Yaima Village, where dozens of traditional homes that have been moved here from other parts of Ishigaki and reassembled as an open-air museum. We finish the day with a visit to the island's largest limestone cave, an underground world full of oddly shaped stalactites and stalagmites that have been eerily illuminated for added drama.

DAY 10 Tuesday 1 December 2026 Taipei

On our sightseeing tour of Taipei, capital of Taiwan, we visit the National Palace Museum, which houses the best collection of Chinese artefacts in the world. Taken from mainland China to Taiwan by the nationalists after their defeat by the communists in 1949, this is the

DAY 14 Saturday 5 December 2026 Da Nang Vietnam

We cross the Hai Van tunnels from Da Nang and drive the scenic road along the coastline to arrive in Hue. Passing through the impressive Ngo Mon gate, we will reach the main pavilion, the Palace of Supreme Harmony. Later we drive through pine forests and orchards to visit one of the numerous imperial tombs that dot the surrounding countryside. Built by the Nguyen Dynasty emperors, each tomb was meant as a place of recreation before being utilised as a final resting place. Tu Duc Tomb resembles a miniature royal palace with an attractive pavilion overlooking a tranquil lake, ornate buildings, fragrant gardens and hunting grounds.

DAY 15 Sunday 6 December 2026


