DAY 1 Monday 20 March, 2023

Mornington

On arrival at Melbourne Airport no later than 1.00 pm. we will be met by our private coach and drive through the picturesque countryside to the Mornington Peninsula. A welcome dinner is included this evening for tour members to get to know one another. Phil Dudman will outline the activities and program of the tour.

DAY 2 Tuesday 21 March, 2023

Mornington

Today we travel to visit some of the best gardens in Australia. Our first visit is to Heronswood Gardens, home of Diggers Seeds and our first Diggers Club garden. The garden will be in glorious autumn colour. In 2011 the Blazey's gifted ownership of the Diggers Club to the Diggers Foundation, which strives to conserve historic gardens, buildings and to protect heirloom seeds. We will have lunch at the Fork to Fork restaurant, where the vegetables and fruits served are heirloom selections picked straight from the gardens. This is followed by a tour of Diggers, who have Australia's largest range of heirloom vegetables, cottage and fruit plants for sale. In the afternoon we visit the Garden Vineyard, featured in Monte Don's Around the World in 80 Gardens. The garden incorporates gorgeous perennial borders. Phil and the tour manager will meet those wishing to have dinner together in the lobby.



DAY 3 Wednesday 22 March, 2023

Mornington

Our first visit today is to Dame Elisabeth Murdoch's garden of Cruden Farm. The star attraction is the main driveway, planted with over 100 lemon scented gum trees. In truth, there are many gardens to enjoy, each one different in style, plantings and mood. Each area was carefully planned by Dame Elisabeth Murdoch and Michael Morrison. To this day Michael is still implementing Dame Elisabeth's long-term plans for various areas across the garden. The Picking Garden truly reflects the changing seasons at Cruden Farm and during Spring and Summer is alive with thousands of blooms and glorious colour. Where food was once grown, as the children left home, Dame Elisabeth replaced fruit and vegetables with more and more blooms. The Walled Garden, originally designed by Edna Walling, has undergone changes since it was first planted out in the early 1930s. We continue with a visit to The Royal Botanic Gardens at Cranbourne. Phil will take us on an exploration of the spectacular landscape which has a dramatic red sand garden, rock pool waterways, eucalypt walk and exhibition gardens all featuring Australian plants.

DAY 4 Thursday 23 March, 2023

Daylesford

This afternoon we will drive to Macedon to visit Forest Glade, a historic private garden that is acknowledged as one of the most beautiful in Australia. It embraces a mixture of landscaping styles taking inspiration from English, Italian and woodland traditions. Phil will show us around the gardens. We continue to Daylesford for our four night stay.

DAY 5 Friday 24 March, 2023

Daylesford

This morning our garden visit is to Stonefields, Paul Bangay's spectacular garden developed using knowledge gained during twenty years designing gardens all around the world. This garden is one of the many highlights of our tour and includes stone paths that meander through garden rooms that open out to a spectacular country view. We return to Daylesford for free time for lunch and to explore Daylesford's array of boutique shops before visiting Simon Rickard's garden. Fighting the urge to become a mere collector, Simon has attempted to wrestle his eclectic botanical tastes into a coherent,



composed garden. Full of exuberant colour, flowers, foliage plants, and exotic rarities from around the world, Simon's garden aims to challenge and inspire visitors. This evening Phil will meet those wishing to dine with the group.

DAY 6 Saturday 25 May, 2023

Daylesford

Our first visit this morning is Lambley, the wonderful garden of acclaimed plantsman David Glen. Situated around an old farmhouse in the hot dry windswept plains of the Central Victorian Goldfields, it features a wide range of colourful, frost and drought hardy plants and is a vibrant showcase of Glen's clever design abilities. The extensive organic veggie garden includes trial gardens for vegetables and flowers. In the afternoon we visit the Ballarat Botanical Gardens. Founded in 1858, it covers an area of forty hectares divided into three distinct zones with a central area preserving the "Gardenesque" style of the Victorian pleasure garden. Located on the western shore of picturesque Lake Wendouree, is the conservatory, a highlight of the gardens that is full of spectacular begonias. Later in the afternoon we'll have free time to enjoy Ballarat's ornate architecture, fine regional art gallery and coffee shops.

DAY 7 Sunday 26 March, 2023

Daylesford

This morning we visit St Erth our second Diggers Club garden. The garden will be in glorious autumn colour. We continue our travels to visit Frogmore Gardens. Fifteen years ago, Zena Bethell and Jack Marshall bought eight acres near Trentham, turning three hectares into a stunning garden and nursery specializing in flowering perennials for the herbaceous border and drought tolerant prairie style gardens.

DAY 8 Monday 27 March, 2023

Melbourne

Today we travel to the Dandenong Ranges to visit two stunning gardens. We first visit Cloudehill where a maze of stone walls and jewel like garden rooms are set within woodlands of historic cool climate trees. We will have an included lunch here as the food is as good as the gorgeous views. This is our third Diggers foundation garden. In the afternoon we travel to Banksia Bend in Yarra Glen for a guided tour. The owner, Rosemary Simpson, came to Banksia Bend in 2000 and later commissioned distinguished landscape designer Phillip Johnson (winner of the gold medal Chelsea 2013), to create a rock and water garden. Rosemary's passion is for sustainable gardens in dry and arid conditions and preserving what little water there is here in Australia. The garden consists of mainly Australian native plants and features three sculptures by renowned Australian artists.



DAY 9 Tuesday 28 March, 2023

Melbourne

This morning we first stop at the Fitzroy gardens where we will see the Conservatory. We continue to the Melbourne Botanic Gardens which covers thirty six hectares. We will visit Guilfoyle's Volcano. Built in 1876 as a water storage for the gardens, it was recently restored as part of a landscape development project. It has commanding views of the city and showcases low water use plants. Boardwalks and a viewing platform give visitors an opportunity to explore this remarkable feature of Melbourne Botanic Gardens. We will continue on to the Observatory with free time to walk with Phil to see the Ian Potter Foundation Children's Garden and the Shrine of Remembrance. We will have free time for lunch at the Observatory Café. You may wander around the gardens or continue on the coach with a drop off in the center of Melbourne. The remainder of the afternoon is free for sightseeing or shopping.

DAY 10 Wednesday 29 March, 2023

Melbourne

Today we visit the 22nd Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show, the biggest and best show of its type in the Southern Hemisphere is ranked in the top five flower shows in the world. Floral displays fill the world heritage listed Royal Exhibition Building and the surrounding Carlton Gardens. Around the building are landscape displays created by some of Australia's most talented landscape designers. Phil will give those interested a tour of the display gardens – pointing out elements used by the designers that we can incorporate in our own backyards. While keen gardeners will want to spend all day at the show, others may also take time to visit the adjacent Melbourne Museum. This evening we will have dinner at a nearby restaurant to say goodbye to Phil and other tour members.

DAY 11 Thursday 30 March, 2023

Departure

The morning is free for individual activity. We travel to the airport about noon for a flight home and the tour concludes.

DAY 1 Tuesday 23 May, 2023

Departure

Our holiday begins with our flight to London.

DAY 2 Wednesday 24 May, 2023

London

On arrival we visit the famous Kew Gardens, London's largest UNESCO World Heritage Site, home to the world's most diverse collection of living plants and a scientific research centre of international renown. Set on 300 acres, we will discover incredible glasshouses including the iconic Palm House with its exotic rainforest, the Princess of Wales Conservatory that features ten of the world's climatic zones, and the Waterlily House with its amazing, giant lily pads. We will check into our hotel and the rest of the day will be free for independent activity.

DAY 3 Thursday 25 May, 2023

London

The highlight of our time in London will be an escorted visit to the famous Chelsea Flower Show. Chelsea is the leading event in the English horticultural calendar and boasts amazing displays of the world's most beautiful flowers and plants. You will see fabulous show gardens specially created by top designers from across the UK and around the world. Phil will ensure that you get the most from this wonderful show. We return to our hotel early afternoon, with an optional drop off at Harrods for those who would like to have time to shop. In the evening we will enjoy a welcome dinner.



DAY 4 Friday 26 May, 2022

London

This morning we will visit Hampton Court Palace and Garden. The Palace offers a fascinating insight into the activities of British monarchs from Henry VIII onwards. The garden is most famous for its Great Vine, planted in 1768, which still produces hundreds of bunches of Black Hamburg grapes each year. The Pond Gardens offer a magnificent display of bedding plants. The newly restored Privy Garden of William III is a spectacular example of baroque design, with parterres, cut work, clipped yews and spring and summer displays of 17th-century plants. We continue with a visit to Raworth's Garden, a private garden in West London. This is a true collectors' garden, with perennial borders, a knot garden, bog garden, conservatory and views to a private park. We also enjoy a lovely afternoon tea. In the evening, Phil will meet those wishing to dine with the group.

DAY 5 Saturday 27 May, 2023

London

Today we visit the Royal Horticultural Society Garden, Wisley, one of the world's great gardens. Wisley Estate was given to the RHS in trust by Sir Thomas Hanbury in 1903. Packed with horticultural inspiration, the garden will capture the imagination with richly planted borders, luscious rose gardens and extraordinary glasshouses which recreate tropical, moist temperate and

dry temperate habitats. A centre for horticultural excellence, trials of flowers, vegetables and fruit continue to be some of the principal features of the garden. Several Chelsea Flower Show prize winning gardens are displayed in the grounds. Our visit will be an interesting look at the history of gardening in Britain. The afternoon will be free to explore London. Why not book a show?

DAY 6 Sunday 28 May, 2023

Siena, Tuscany, Italy

Today we fly to Rome. On arrival we travel north to the region of Tuscany for our three night stay in the medieval town of Siena. Famous for its cuisine, art, museums and medieval cityscape, the historic centre has been declared by UNESCO a World Heritage Site. On the journey, we visit the magnificent gardens of Villa Lante near Viterbo. This is a classic Renaissance garden in which murmuring water, flashing fountains, shade and sunlight alternate under vast plane trees. The garden has perfect symmetry, organised on four levels along a main axis and emphasised by fountains.

DAY 7 Monday 29 May, 2023

Siena

This morning we visit Villa Cetinale, built in the 15th century by the Chigi family, bankers and money lenders for Popes and English kings. Additions to the original house and garden were carried out by Carlo Fontana, who was a pupil of Bernini. In the gardens are wonderful statues and the Romitorio, a hermitage where monks lived until near the end of the 19th century. Lord Lambton bought Vila Cetinale from the Chigi family in 1977 and since then the gardens have been immaculately restored and enriched. After our garden visit, a local guide will introduce us to the major sights of Siena, including the Piazza del Campo with its splendid civic tower and the enormous, partially completed Duomo. The biennial Palio horse race festival is held here. Siena is also home to the oldest bank in the world and a spectacular town hall.

DAY 8 Tuesday 30 May, 2023

Siena

We travel to visit La Foce, established by the author Iris Origo and her husband Marquis Antonio Origo, on the site of an Osteria. They contacted English architect, Cecil Pinsent in 1927 to help them design their garden. Pinsent planted cypresses and hollies like a frame surrounding the garden. Inside the frame there is an Italian Renaissance garden, a fountain garden, an orangery and an upper flower garden inspired by the planting style of famous English designer, Gertrude Jekyll. We travel to Bagno Vignoni, a small Orcia River valley village, which has long been a favorite among painters and





travelers seeking solitude in a beautiful location with time to explore. There, we visit Le Terme, a small family-owned 15th century hotel built by Rossellino as a summerhouse for Pope Pius II, who enjoyed the advantage of the nearby hot mineral springs. For the remainder of the afternoon, we will enjoy free time in Siena.

DAY 9 Wednesday 31 May, 2023

Florence, Tuscany, Italy

We drive through the gorgeous Tuscan countryside to Florence this morning. On arrival we enjoy a walking tour of the historical center of Florence. During our walking tour we will explore Piazza del Duomo, with the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, one of the largest cathedrals in the Christian world. Together with Brunelleschi's wonderful dome, we see the Campanile and the Baptistery. We also wander through the Piazza della Signoria, which contains the Loggia della Signoria, the Palazzo Vecchio and nearby, the Ponte Vecchio over the Arno River. The remainder of the day is free to explore Florence.

DAY 10 Thursday 1 June, 2023

Florence

This morning we visit Villa Le Balze, an early masterpiece of English architect Cecil Pinsent who designed a Renaissance-style villa set in just over one hectare of garden. The garden was created in 1914 on a very steep site overlooking spectacular views of Florence. To the sides of the house are enclosed formal garden rooms. The lemon garden next to the house has four box-edged lawn enclosures surrounding a circular pool. The formal gardens give way to a Bosco and olive groves. We continue our travel to explore Villa Gamberaia, set in classic olive-grove country. Restored to its 16th century splendour, the garden is small but idyllic. The main terrace is laid out with parterres de broderie and the water gardens are reminiscent of Persian reflecting pools.



DAY 11 Friday 2 June, 2023

Florence

This morning is free to explore Florence. In the afternoon, we visit Villa della Petraia, a Medici property. Bought in 1544 by Cosimo de' Medici, he gave it to his fifth son Ferdinando. On the upper terraces, simple square compartments were lined with dwarf fruit trees, highly prized in Renaissance gardens. In 1864, Florence was adopted as the temporary capital of Italy. Petraia became the royal residence of Emanuele II of Savoy, and the garden was changed to suit his taste. Curving flower beds in 19th century style were designed to surround the fountain.

DAY 12 Saturday 3 June, 2023

Como, Italian Lakes

We travel by coach north to Pistoia, an area with numerous wholesale plant nurseries, which specialise in large trees and topiaries. Many of the very advanced specimen trees that feature at the Chelsea Flower show are sourced from these nurseries. Our guided tour of the Vannucci Piante nursery, which exports plants to 48 countries around the world, is a fascinating insight into the business side of horticulture, and some of the specimens will amaze you. We continue our journey to Como situated on gorgeous Lake Como. In the evening Phil will meet those wishing to dine with the group in the lobby.

DAY 13 Sunday 4 June, 2023

Como

A scenic trip along the west shore of Lake Como brings us to the picturesque village of Tremezzo and Villa Carlotta. This elegant 18th century villa has its own landing place on Lake Como and beautiful views over the lake. It was

given as a wedding present to Carlotta, Duchess of Saxe-Meiningen, who, with her husband, created the landscaped gardens and began the botanical collection. Around the house, an 18th century formal layout has lemon arbours on the terraces, flower beds, and tall camellia hedges that reflect the architecture. This afternoon, we visit Villa Balbianello, one of the jewels of the lake, located on a small promontory and accessed by boat. Steep steps lead from the landing to an avenue of candelabra-pruned plane trees and the loggia, garlanded with creeping fig. The villa perches high above Lake Como and is filled with an astounding personal collection of furniture and artefacts.

DAY 14 Monday 5 June, 2023

Como

This morning we drive to Stresa, a gorgeous town on the shore of Lake Maggiore. We stop on the foreshore to board our private boat across to Isola Bella, the most spectacular of the Borromean Islands. The magnificent villa is surrounded by one of the most dramatic 17th century gardens in Italy, with 10 terraces rising like a ship's prow in the reflecting waters of the lake. Masses of roses and perfumed plants set among superb statues and fountains make this a garden to remember. We visit the nearby island Isola Madre, so very different with its lush sub-tropical planting of ornamental trees and shrubs in a parkland style of the early 19th century. Phil will meet those wishing to dine with the group.

DAY 15 Tuesday 6 June, 2023

Como

On boarding our ferry we sail to Bellagio. We will have time to explore the town of Bellagio, nominated as one of the most beautiful villages in the world. Phil will guide us on a visit to the gardens of Villa Melzi. The semi-classical villa stands on the shores of the lake, among gardens studded with an eclectic mix of sculptures, from Egyptian to Roman. We return by ferry to Como. The afternoon will be free for individual exploration.

DAY 16 Wednesday 7 June, 2023

Venice

We depart Como to travel to Verona, the setting for the play Romeo and Juliet, where we stop for lunch at leisure before visiting Giardini di Giusto; one of finest examples of an Italian garden. It was created in the 1400s, with the layout commissioned in 1570 by Gostino Giusti. The garden includes parterres, a hedge maze and many statues. According to legend, if lovers find themselves in the "little labyrinth" they are destined to eternal love! We continue to the Veneto area, before transferring to our hotel in Venice by motor launch. Venice, the capital of northern Italy's Veneto region, is built on more than 100 small islands in a lagoon in the Adriatic Sea. It has no roads, just canals – including the Grand Canal thoroughfare – lined with Renaissance and Gothic palaces

DAY 17 Thursday 8 June, 2023

Venice

This morning's guided sightseeing tour of Venice will introduce you to this fabled city. We visit the iconic Piazza San Marco and its grand cathedral; see the Grand Canal, the Doges Palace and the Bridge of Sighs. We will wind our way through the narrow alleyways to the market square of the Rialto and learn about Venice's history and culture. The rest of the day will be free for independent exploration - perhaps experience a gondola ride or get a bird's eye view of Venice from one of the belltowers, or just wander the entrancing maze of streets and canals, window-shopping and people-watching. Phil will meet those wishing to dine with the group in the lobby this evening or you may like to take in a concert.

DAY 18 Friday 9 June, 2023

Venice

A day spent exploring some of the beautiful hidden gardens of Venice. We meet our guides, members of the Venice Garden Club, who will provide entry to some very special and beautiful private gardens. The rest of the day is at leisure. Among the many options, there are galleries and museums, a ferry trip to the islands of Murano and Burano, and of course, the countless enticing shops. This evening we will enjoy a farewell dinner to say goodbye to other tour members.

DAY 19 Saturday 10 June, 2023

Departure

Today we transfer to Venice Airport for our return flight to Australia.

DAY 20 Sunday 11 June, 2023

Arrive Australia

The group arrives in Australia and tour arrangements conclude.
